Dear Ms. Mance:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 619541 (Ref: COD16-017).

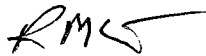
The City of Dickinson (the "city"), which you represent, received a request for audio and video recordings of a specified incident. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.130 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.130 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure information that relates to a motor vehicle operator's license or driver's license or a motor vehicle title or registration issued by a Texas agency, or an agency of another state or country. *See* Gov't Code § 552.130(a)(1)-(2). Upon review, we find the submitted video recordings contain both audible and visually discernible motor vehicle record information subject to section 552.130. We note the audio portions of the video recordings are intertwined with the video portions of the recordings. We note, and you inform us, that the requestor is not the owner of the vehicle in the submitted information. You state the city does not have the technological ability to redact information from the video recordings. Accordingly, we find the city must withhold the video recordings in their entireties under section 552.130 of the Government Code.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
