Dear Ms. Pajak:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 648053 (PIR No. 27214).

The Texas Medical Board (the "board") received a request for all of the board's audits, documentation, correspondence, and applications relating to PMC 00302 and PMC 0303. The board states it has released some information. The board claims the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under sections 552.101 and 552.103 of the Government Code. We have considered the exceptions the board claims and reviewed the submitted representative sample of information.¹

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from required public disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. This section encompasses information protected by other statutes, such as section 164.007(c) of the Occupations Code, which provides:

Each complaint, adverse report, investigation file, other investigation report,
and other investigative information in the possession of or received or

gathered by the board or its employees or agents relating to a license holder, an application for license, or a criminal investigation or proceeding is privileged and confidential and is not subject to discovery, subpoena, or other means of legal compulsion for release to anyone other than the board or its employees or agents involved in discipline of a license holder. For purposes of this subsection, investigative information includes information relating to the identity of, and a report made by, a physician performing or supervising compliance monitoring for the board.

Occ. Code § 164.007(c). The board states Exhibit 4 consists of information gathered, collected, or received by the board during the board's investigation of a physician who operates two registered pain management clinics. The board states Exhibit 5 consists of information gathered, collected, or received by the board during the board's investigation of the pain management clinic application for one of the pain management clinics. Thus, we understand the information at issue consists of investigative information held by the board that is related to a physician license holder. Based on these representations and our review, we agree the information at issue is made confidential by section 164.007(c). We have no indication the disclosure provisions in section 164.007 apply. *Id.* § 164.007(d), (f), (h). Thus, we conclude the information at issue is the same type of information that was at issue in Open Records Letter No. 2007-03117 (2007). That ruling serves as a previous determination under section 552.301(a) of the Government Code for the board with respect to investigative information that is in the possession of or was received or gathered by the board during the investigation of a license holder under chapter 164 of the Occupations Code. Therefore, pursuant to the previous determination in Open Records Letter No. 2007-03117, the board must withhold the information at issue under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 164.007(c) of the Occupations Code.² *See* Open Records Decision No. 673 (2001) (governmental body may rely on previous determination when elements of law, fact, and circumstances have not changed, decision concludes specific, clearly delineated category of information is excepted, and governmental body is explicitly informed it need not seek a decision from this office to withhold information in response to future requests).

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
