Dear Ms. McCarthy:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 662125 (HCAD Internal Ref. No. 17-1695).

The Harris County Appraisal District (the "district") received a request for the iFile number associated with a specified account. You claim portions of the submitted information are excepted from disclosure under section 552.136 of the Government Code.¹ We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Initially, we note the requestor only seeks the iFile number associated with the specified account. Accordingly, the remaining information is not responsive to the instant request, and the district need not release non-responsive information in response to this request.

Section 552.136 of the Government Code provides, "[n]otwithstanding any other provision of [the Act], a credit card, debit card, charge card, or access device number that is collected, assembled, or maintained by or for a governmental body is confidential." Gov't Code § 552.136(b). Section 552.136(a) defines "access device" as "a card, plate, code, account

number, personal identification number, electronic serial number, mobile identification number, or other telecommunications service, equipment, or instrument identifier or means of account access that alone or in conjunction with another access device may be used to . . . obtain money, goods, services, or another thing of value [or] initiate a transfer of funds other than a transfer originated solely by paper instrument.” *Id.* § 552.136(a). You represent the iFile number you have marked can be used to access confidential property information that is valuable to property owners and third party professionals involved in the protests of property tax appraisals. Based on your representations and our review, we agree the iFile number at issue is an access device number for purposes of section 552.136(a). Accordingly, the district must withhold the iFile number you have marked under section 552.136(b) of the Government Code.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
