Dear Ms. Zellers:

The Office of the Attorney General has received your request for a ruling and assigned your request ID# 673052.

After reviewing your arguments and the submitted information, we have determined your request does not present a novel or complex issue. Thus, we are addressing your claims in a memorandum opinion. You claim the three-page supplement may be withheld from the requestor pursuant to section 552.108(a)(1) of the Government Code. We have considered your arguments and the information and have determined that in accordance with section 552.108(a)(1) you may withhold the three-page supplement. Lastly, you must withhold the date of birth in the rest of the information pursuant to section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with common-law privacy. *Paxton v. City of Dallas*, No. 03-13-00546-CV, 2015 WL 3394061, at *3 (Tex. App.—Austin May 22, 2015, pet. denied) (mem. op.). We note the requestor has a right of access to her date of birth. Gov't Code § 552.023 (governmental body may not deny access to person to whom information relates solely on grounds that information is considered confidential by privacy principles).
