Dear Ms. Godden:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 673830 (District ID# LJISD-061).

The La Joya Independent School District (the "district"), which you represent, received a request for the six most recent invoices and bills of lading involving the purchase of specified goods. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.104 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.


Section 552.104(a) of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information that, if released, would give advantage to a competitor or bidder." Gov't Code § 552.104(a). The "test under section 552.104 is whether knowing another bidder's [or competitor's information] would be an advantage, not whether it would be a decisive advantage." *Boeing Co. v. Paxton*, 466 S.W.3d 831 (Tex. 2015). You state the submitted information relates to pricing charged for certain goods. You explain the district seeks bids for these goods on a recurring basis. You also state the district was engaged in the bidding process for the goods at issue at the time the present request was received. Thus, you assert release of the submitted information would provide a competitive advantage to bidders. After review of the information at issue and consideration of the arguments, we find the district has established the release of the information would give advantage to a competitor or bidder.

Thus, we conclude the district may withhold the submitted information under section 552.104(a) of the Government Code.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
