Dear Ms. McGowan:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 679114 (ORR# 16396).

The Dallas Independent School District (the "district") received a request for twenty categories of information pertaining to district teachers, enrollment numbers for the district, and payroll information pertaining to district teachers. You state you will release some information. You claim some of the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. Section 552.101 of the Government Code encompasses section 21.355 of the Education Code. Section 21.355(a) provides that "[a] document evaluating the performance of a teacher or administrator is confidential and is not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code." Act of May 16, 2017, 85th Leg., R.S., S.B. 7, § 14 (to be codified as an amendment to Educ. Code § 21.355(a)). This office has interpreted section 21.355 to apply to any document that evaluates, as that term is commonly understood, the performance of a teacher or an administrator. *See* Open Records Decision No. 643 (1996). We have determined that for purposes of section 21.355, "teacher" means a person who is required to and does in fact hold a teaching certificate under subchapter B of chapter 21 of the Education Code or a school district teaching permit under section 21.055 and who is engaged in the process of teaching, as that term is commonly defined, at the time


of the evaluation. *See id.* at 4. The Third Court of Appeals has concluded a written reprimand constitutes an evaluation for purposes of section 21.355, because “it reflects the principal’s judgment regarding [a teacher’s] actions, gives corrective direction, and provides for further review.” *See North East Indep. Sch. Dist. v. Abbott*, 212 S.W.3d 364 (Tex. App.—Austin 2006, no pet.).

You state the information you marked evaluates the performance of teachers employed by the district. You further state the individuals at issue held the appropriate certifications at the time of the evaluations. Upon review, we find the information you marked consists of “[a] document evaluating the performance of a teacher or administrator” as contemplated by section 21.355 of the Education Code. *See* Educ. Code § 21.353 (teachers shall be appraised only on basis of classroom teaching performance and not in connection with extracurricular activities). Therefore, the district must withhold the information it marked under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 21.355 of the Education Code. The district must release the remaining information.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
