Dear Mr. Anderson:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 679662 (PIR No. 17PIA353).

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office (the "sheriff's office") received a request for a report pertaining to the requestor. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. Section 552.101 encompasses section 58.008 of the Family Code, which provides, in part:

(b) Except as provided by Subsection (d), law enforcement records concerning a child and information concerning a child that are stored by electronic means or otherwise and from which a record could be generated may not be disclosed to the public and shall be:

(1) if maintained on paper or microfilm, kept separate from adult records;

(2) if maintained electronically in the same computer system as adult records, accessible only under controls that are separate and distinct from the controls to access electronic data concerning adults; and

(3) maintained on a local basis only and not sent to a central state or federal depository, except as provided by Subsection (c) or Subchapter B, D, or E.

Act of May 28, 2017, 85th Leg., R.S., S.B. 1304, § 13 (to be codified at Fam. Code § 58.008(b)); *see also* Fam. Code § 51.03(a) (defining “delinquent conduct” for purposes of title 3 of Family Code); Act of May 19, 2017, 85th Leg., R.S., S.B. 1488, § 7.002 (to be codified as amendments to Fam. Code § 51.03(b)); Act of May 30, 2017, 85th Leg., R.S., H.B. 29, § 21 (to be codified as amendments to Fam. Code § 51.03(b)) (defining “conduct indicating a need for supervision”). Section 58.008(b) is applicable to records of juvenile conduct that occurred before, on, or after September 1, 2017. *See* Act of May 28, 2017, 85th Leg., R.S., S.B. 1304, § 22. The juvenile must have been at least 10 years old and less than 17 years of age when the conduct occurred. *See* Fam. Code § 51.02(2) (defining “child” for purposes of title 3 of Family Code). We understand the sheriff’s office to argue the submitted information is subject to section 58.008(b) of the Family Code.¹ We find the submitted information involves a juvenile offender, so as to fall within the scope of section 58.008(b). However, we are unable to determine the age of the suspect listed in the information at issue. Accordingly, we must rule conditionally. If the suspect at issue was ten years of age or older and under seventeen years of age at the time of the conduct at issue, then, as it does not appear any of the exceptions in section 58.008 apply, the sheriff’s office must withhold the submitted information in its entirety under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 58.008(b) of the Family Code. However, if the suspect at issue was under ten years of age or was seventeen years of age or older at the time of the conduct, then the information does not involve juvenile conduct for purposes of section 58.008(b) of the Family Code, and no portion of the submitted information may be withheld under section 552.101 of the Government Code on that basis.

Section 552.130 of the Government Code provides information relating to a motor vehicle operator’s license, driver’s license, motor vehicle title or registration, or a personal identification document issued by an agency of this state or another state or country is excepted from public release.² Gov’t Code § 552.130. Upon review, we find the sheriff’s office must withhold the motor vehicle record information we have marked under section 552.130 of the Government Code.

In summary, if the suspect at issue was ten years of age or older and under seventeen years of age at the time of the conduct at issue, then the sheriff’s office must withhold the submitted information in its entirety under section 552.101 of the Government Code in

conjunction with section 58.008(b) of the Family Code. However, if the suspect at issue was under ten years of age or was seventeen years of age or older at the time of the conduct, then the sheriff's office must withhold the information we have marked under section 552.130 of the Government Code and must release the remaining information.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.
