Dear Ms. Hickman:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 685598.

The Beaumont Police Department (the "department") received a request for all information pertaining to a specified event number. The department states it has released most of the requested information. The department claims the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.130 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception the department claims and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.130 excepts from disclosure information relating to a motor vehicle operator's license, driver's license, motor vehicle title or registration, or personal identification document issued by an agency of this state or another state or country is excepted from public release. *See* Gov't Code § 552.130. The department asserts, and we agree, the video recordings we have indicated contain motor vehicle record information that is excepted from disclosure under section 552.130 of the Government Code. In this instance, the department states it does not possess the technological capability to redact information from video files. Thus, we agree the department must withhold the video recordings we have indicated in their entireties under section 552.130 of the Government Code. *See* Open Records Decision No. 364 (1983). However, the remaining video recording does not contain motor vehicle record information protected by section 552.130 of the Government Code and thus, the

department may not withhold it on that basis. Therefore, the department must release the remaining video recording.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
