Dear Ms. Calcote:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 759722 (DPS PIRs 19-0431, 19-0453, 19-0489, 19-0536, 19-0550, 19-0579, 19-0583, and 19-0584).

The Texas Department of Public Safety (the "department") received eight requests from different requestors for information pertaining to the Office of the Secretary of State's (the "SOS") voter registration roll maintenance effort. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under sections 552.101, 552.103, 552.107, 552.111, and 552.139 of the Government Code. You also state you notified the Office of the Governor (the "OOG") and the SOS of the requests for information and of their right to submit arguments to this office as to why the submitted information should not be released. *See Gov't Code* § 552.304 (interested party may submit comments stating why information should or should not be released). We have received comments from the OOG and the SOS. We have also received comments from Office of the Attorney General (the "OAG"). *See id.* We have considered the submitted arguments and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.108(a)(1) of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "[i]nformation held by a law enforcement agency . . . that deals with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime . . . if . . . release of the information would interfere with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime[.]" *Id.* § 552.108(a)(1). A governmental body asserting section 552.108(a)(1) must explain how and why the requested information would interfere with law enforcement. *See id.* §§ 552.108(a)(1), .301(e)(1)(A); *see also Ex parte Pruitt*, 551 S.W.2d 706 (Tex. 1976). Section 552.108 may be invoked by the proper


custodian of information relating to a pending investigation or prosecution of criminal conduct. *See* Open Records Decision No. 474 at 4-5 (1987). Thus, where an agency has custody of information that would otherwise qualify for exception under section 552.108 as information relating to the pending case of a law enforcement agency, the custodian of the records may withhold the information if it provides this office with a demonstration the information relates to the pending case and a representation from the law enforcement agency that it wishes to have the information withheld.

The OAG has advised this office the submitted information relates to an open criminal investigation conducted by the OAG's Election Fraud Section of the Criminal Prosecutions Division. Further, the OAG states release of the information at issue would interfere with the pending investigation. Based upon these representations, we conclude the release of the submitted information would interfere with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime. *See Houston Chronicle Publ'g Co. v. City of Houston*, 531 S.W.2d 177 (Tex. Civ. App.—Houston [14th Dist.] 1975) (court delineates law enforcement interests that are present in active cases), *writ ref'd n.r.e. per curiam*, 536 S.W.2d 559 (Tex. 1976). Thus, section 552.108(a)(1) is applicable to the submitted information. Accordingly, the department may withhold the submitted information under section 552.108(a)(1) of the Government Code on behalf of the OAG.<sup>1</sup>

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
