Dear Mr. Meitler:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 777584 (ORR# 38184).

The Texas Education Agency ("TEA") received a request for questions from a specified State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR) exam. TEA claims the requested information is excepted from disclosure under sections 552.101 and 552.122 of the Government Code. We have considered the claimed exceptions and reviewed the submitted representative sample of information.¹

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." *Id.* § 552.101. This exception encompasses section 39.030(a) of the Education Code, which provides as follows:

(a) In adopting academic skills assessment instruments under [subchapter B, chapter 39 of the Education Code], the State Board of Education or a school district shall ensure the security of the instruments and tests in their preparation, administration, and grading. Meetings or portions of meetings


held by the State Board of Education or a school district at which individual assessment instruments or assessment instrument items are disclosed or adopted are not open to the public under Chapter 551, Government Code, and the assessment instruments or assessment instrument items are confidential.

Educ. Code § 39.030(a). TEA states it has the authority to adopt and administer the STAAR test pursuant to the academic skills assessment program adopted by the State Board of Education under chapter 39 of the Education Code. *See id.* §§ 39.022, .023. TEA informs us the information at issue constitutes the assessment instrument items for a particular STAAR writing assessment that was administered in 2019. Based on these representations and our review of the submitted information, we agree the information at issue is confidential under section 39.030(a) of the Education Code and TEA must withhold it under section 552.101 of the Government Code.²

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.
