Dear Ms. Rathel:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 791144 (Reference No. LGL 19-127).

The Waco Police Department (the "department") received a request for specified video recordings pertaining to a specified motor vehicle accident. You claim the submitted information is not subject to the Act pursuant to section 1701.661 of the Occupations Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Initially, we note the submitted information includes a city police officer's body worn camera recording. Body worn cameras are subject to chapter 1701 of the Occupations Code. Chapter 1701 provides the procedures a requestor must follow when seeking a body worn camera recording. Section 1701.661(a) provides:

A member of the public is required to provide the following information when submitting a written request to a law enforcement agency for information recorded by a body worn camera:

- (1) the date and approximate time of the recording;
- (2) the specific location where the recording occurred; and
- (3) the name of one or more persons known to be a subject of the recording.

Occ. Code § 1701.661(a). In this instance, the requestor does not give the requisite information under section 1701.661(a). As the requestor did not properly request the body worn camera recording at issue pursuant to chapter 1701, our ruling does not reach this information and it need not be released. However, pursuant to section 1701.661(b), a “failure to provide all the information required by Subsection (a) to be part of a request for recorded information does not preclude the requestor from making a future request for the same recorded information.” *Id.* § 1701.661(b). We note the remaining information consists of surveillance video recordings. We find this information does not consist of body worn camera recordings. Therefore, the remaining information is not subject to section 1701.661 of the Occupations Code and the department may not withhold any portion of the remaining information on that basis.

Section 552.130 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure information that relates to a motor vehicle operator’s license, driver’s license, motor vehicle title, or registration issued by this state or another state or country.¹ Gov’t Code § 552.130(a)(1), (2). Accordingly, the department must withhold the visible license plates in the remaining information under section 552.130 of the Government Code.

In summary, the submitted body worn camera recording at issue was not properly requested pursuant to chapter 1701 of the Occupations Code and need not be released to this requestor in response to this request for information. The department must withhold the visible license plates in the remaining information under section 552.130 of the Government Code. The department must release the remaining information.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor. For more information concerning those rights and
