Dear Mr. Hansen:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 800791 (PIR# W091031).

The City of Fort Worth (the "city") received a request for a body worn camera recording pertaining to a specified motor vehicle accident involving the requestor's client. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. Body worn cameras are subject to chapter 1701 of the Occupations Code. Chapter 1701 provides the procedures a requestor must follow when seeking a body worn camera recording. Section 1701.661(a) provides:

A member of the public is required to provide the following information when submitting a written request to a law enforcement agency for information recorded by a body worn camera:

- (1) the date and approximate time of the recording;

- (2) the specific location where the recording occurred; and
- (3) the name of one or more persons known to be a subject of the recording.

Occ. Code § 1701.661(a). Upon review of the information at issue, we determine the requestor provided the information required by section 1701.661(a) of the Occupations Code for release of the body worn camera recording at issue. However, section 1701.661(f) provides, in relevant part:

A law enforcement agency may not release any portion . . . of a recording involving the investigation of conduct that constitutes a misdemeanor punishable by fine only and does not result in arrest, without written authorization from the person who is the subject of that portion of the recording or, if the person is deceased, from the person's authorized representative.

Id. § 1701.661(f). The city states the video recording at issue consists of a body worn camera recording involving an investigation of conduct that constitutes a misdemeanor punishable by fine only and that did not result in an arrest. The city states it does not have permission for release from all the subjects of the recording at issue. *See id.* Accordingly, we find the city must withhold the body worn camera recording under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 1701.661(f) of the Occupations Code.

You also ask this office to issue a previous determination permitting the city to withhold body worn camera recordings involving the investigation of a motor vehicle accident that constitutes a misdemeanor punishable by fine only and does not result in arrest, and are without written authorization from all subjects of the recordings under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 1701.661(f) of the Occupations Code without seeking a ruling from this office. *See Gov't Code* § 552.301(a) (allowing governmental body to withhold information subject to previous determination); Open Records Decision No. 673 (2001) (listing elements of second type of previous determination under section 552.301(a) of the Government Code). We decline to issue such a ruling at this time. Accordingly, this letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
