Dear Mr. Monk:

The Office of the Attorney General has received your request for a ruling and assigned your request ID# 809283 (ORU No. 19-12170).

After reviewing your arguments and the submitted information, we have determined your request does not present a novel or complex issue. Thus, we are addressing your claims in a memorandum opinion. You claim the submitted information must be withheld from the requestor. Upon review of your arguments and the submitted information, we conclude you must withhold Exhibit 2 pursuant to section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 58.008(b) of the Family Code.<sup>1</sup> We conclude you must withhold Exhibit 3 under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 261.201 of the Family Code.

As our ruling is dispositive for this information, we need not address your remaining argument against its disclosure.
