Dear Mr. Meitler:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 808810 (ORR# 40458).

The Texas Education Agency (the "TEA") received a request for information related to a specified school district, including a specified complaint. The TEA states it is withholding student-identifying information pursuant to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"), section 1232g of title 20 of the United States Code.<sup>1</sup> The TEA claims the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.116 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception the TEA claims and reviewed the submitted representative sample of information.<sup>2</sup>

See Open Records Decision Nos. 499 (1988), 497 (1988). This open records letter does not reach, and therefore does not authorize the withholding of, any other requested records to the extent those records contain substantially different types of information than that submitted to this office.

Section 552.116 of the Government Code provides,

(a) An audit working paper of an audit of the state auditor or the auditor of a state agency, an institution of higher education as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, a county, a municipality, a school district, a hospital district, or a joint board operating under Section 22.074, Transportation Code, including any audit relating to the criminal history background check of a public school employee, is excepted from [required public disclosure]. If information in an audit working paper is also maintained in another record, that other record is not excepted from [public disclosure] by this section.

(b) In this section:

(1) "Audit" means an audit authorized or required by a statute of this state or the United States, the charter or an ordinance of a municipality, an order of the commissioners court of a county, the bylaws adopted by or other action of the governing board of a hospital district, a resolution or other action of a board of trustees of a school district, including an audit by the district relating to the criminal history background check of a public school employee, or a resolution or other action of a joint board described by Subsection (a) and includes an investigation.

(2) "Audit working paper" includes all information, documentary or otherwise, prepared or maintained in conducting an audit or preparing an audit report, including:

(A) intra-agency and interagency communications; and

(B) drafts of the audit report or portions of those drafts.


Gov't Code § 552.116. The TEA states the submitted information consists of audit working papers prepared or maintained by the TEA's Division of Governance and Investigations. The TEA informs us the audit at issue is authorized by section 39.057(a)(16) of the Education Code. *See* Educ. Code § 39.057(a)(16). Based on these representations and our review, we agree the information at issue consists of audit working papers for purposes of section 552.116. Therefore, the TEA may withhold the submitted information under section 552.116 of the Government Code.

The TEA also asks this office to issue a previous determination that would permit it to withhold information under section 552.116 of the Government Code without requesting a ruling from this office. Open Records Decision No. 673 (2001). We decline to issue such a previous determination at this time. Accordingly, this letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.
