Dear Mr. Falgoust:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 830790 (PIR Nos. C061927, C062042, C062480, C062344, C062258, C061675, C062658, C063656, C062280, and C063869).

The City of Austin (the "city") received eleven requests from ten requestors for specified information pertaining to a specified city health policy during defined periods. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted representative sample of information.<sup>1</sup>

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. This section encompasses section 81.046 of the Health and Safety Code, which provides, in part:

(b) Reports, records, and information relating to cases or suspected cases of diseases or health conditions are not public information under [the Act], and may not be released or made public on subpoena or otherwise except as provided by Subsections (c), (c-1), (d), and (f).

Health & Safety Code § 81.046(b). In Open Records Decision No. 577 (1990), this office concluded any information acquired or created during an investigation under chapter 81 of the Health and Safety Code is confidential and may not be released unless an exception in the statute applies. *See id.* § 81.046(b)-(d), (f); ORD 577. You state the submitted information relates to the investigation of cases or suspected cases of a suspected infectious disease; thus, section 81.046 governs the release of the information at issue. You state the release provisions of section 81.046 are not applicable. You also state you have not received consent from the individuals identified in the submitted information. Accordingly, the city must withhold the submitted information under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 81.046(b) of the Health and Safety Code.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
