Dear Ms. Freeland:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 841242 (ORR# 20-1826, 20-2122).

The Texas Department of Public Safety ("DPS") received two requests from different requestors for the bid tab for a specified project. DPS claims the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.104 of the Government Code. We have considered the claimed exception and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.104(a) of the Government Code excepts from disclosure information that a governmental body demonstrates, if released, would "harm its interests by providing an advantage to a competitor or bidder in a particular ongoing competitive situation or in a particular competitive situation where the governmental body establishes the situation at issue is set to reoccur or there is a specific and demonstrable intent to enter into the competitive situation again in the future." *See id.* § 552.104(a). The "test under section 552.104 is whether knowing another bidder's [or competitor's information] would be an advantage, not whether it would be a decisive advantage." *Boeing Co. v. Paxton*, 466 S.W.3d 831, 841 (Tex. 2015). Upon review, we find DPS has failed to demonstrate the applicability of section 552.104 to the information at issue. Thus, we conclude DPS may not withhold the information at issue under section 552.104(a). Therefore, DPS must release the submitted information.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.
