Dear Mr. Monk:

The Office of the Attorney General has received your request for a ruling and assigned your request ID# 853594.

After reviewing your arguments and the submitted information, we have determined your request does not present a novel or complex issue. Thus, we are addressing your claims in a memorandum opinion. We understand you do not have information responsive to a portion of the requests.¹ You claim the submitted information must be withheld from the requestor. Upon review of your arguments and the submitted information, we conclude you must withhold Exhibits 2 and 3 pursuant to section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 261.201 of the Family Code. You claim Exhibit 4 may be withheld from the requestor pursuant to section 552.108(a)(1) of the Government Code. Upon review of your arguments and the information at issue, we conclude you may withhold Exhibit 4 under section 552.108(a)(1).

¹The Act does not require a governmental body to release information that did not exist when a request for information was received or to prepare new information in response to a request. *See Econ.
