Dear Mr. Lin:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 847061 (GC No. 26794).

The City of Houston (the "city") received a request for a specified bid tabulation. Although you take no position as to whether the submitted information is excepted from disclosure, you state release of this information may implicate the proprietary interests of AdPrint International, Inc.; Bankson d/b/a Alamo Tees & Advertising; BGM Promotional, L.L.C.; Cowgirl Holdings, L.L.C.; Dena Joy Davidson, L.L.C.; GG Outfitters; International Plastics; Jammart USA; Mavich Mavich; Marketability, Inc.; Net Results; New Resources Group, Inc.; Project Promotions; PrimeUSA, Inc.; and The Urban Circle, L.L.C. Accordingly, you notified these third parties of the request for information and of each company's right to submit arguments to this office as to why the submitted information should not be released. *See* Gov't Code § 552.305(d); *see also* Open Records Decision No. 542 (1990) (statutory predecessor to section 552.305 permits governmental body to rely on interested third party to raise and explain applicability of exception in Act in certain circumstances). We have reviewed the submitted information.

An interested third party is allowed ten business days after the date of its receipt of the governmental body's notice under section 552.305(d) of the Government Code to submit its reasons, if any, as to why requested information relating to it should be withheld from disclosure. *See* Gov't Code § 552.305(d)(2)(B). As of the date of this letter, this office has not received comments from the notified third parties explaining why their information should not be released to the requestor. Thus, we have no basis to conclude the release of the information would implicate the interests of the third parties, and none of the information may be withheld on that basis. *See, e.g., id.* § 552.110 (requiring provision of

specific factual evidence demonstrating applicability of exception). As no exceptions to disclosure have been raised, the city must release the submitted information.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
