Dear Ms. Mitchell:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 855764.

The Texas Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners (the "board") received a request for information related to a specified complaint against the requestor's client. The board claims the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception the board claims and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. This exception encompasses information made confidential by section 801.207 of the Occupations Code, which provides, in part:

(b) Each complaint, investigation file and record, and other investigation report and all other investigative information in the possession of or received or gathered by the board or the board's employees or agents relating to a license holder, an application for license, or a criminal investigation or proceeding is privileged and confidential and is not subject to discovery, subpoena, or other means of legal compulsion for release to anyone other than the board or the board's employees or agents involved in discipline of a license holder.

Occ. Code § 801.207(b). The board informs us under its procedures, an investigation file is opened upon receipt of a complaint, and any matters related to that complaint and subsequent investigation become part of the investigation record. The board states the

submitted information relates to a complaint filed with the board after September 1, 2017, and this information is contained within the investigation file. Further, the board states section 801.207(d) of the Occupations Code does not apply to the information at issue. Based on these representations and our review, we find the board must withhold the submitted information under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 801.207(b) of the Occupations Code.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.
