Dear Mr. Richards:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 860786 (ORR# 21-2320).

The Texas Department of Motor Vehicles (the "department") received a request for information pertaining to a specified case. The department claims the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the claimed exception and reviewed the submitted representative sample of information.¹

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. This section encompasses section 1004.003 of the Transportation Code, which provides as follows:

Information obtained during an investigation of a person regulated under Chapter 2301 or 2302, Occupations Code, or Chapter 503 or 643 of [the Transportation Code] is confidential and not subject to disclosure under [the Act], until the investigation is dismissed or finally resolved only if the

disclosure of that information would interfere with or jeopardize the investigation.

Transp. Code § 1004.003. The department states and indicates the submitted information pertains to a pending investigation of a person regulated under one or more chapters listed under section 1004.003. The department asserts release of the submitted information would interfere with or jeopardize the investigation. Based on these representations, we conclude the department must withhold the submitted information under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 1004.003 of the Transportation Code.

The department also asks this office to issue a previous determination that would permit it to withhold information pursuant to section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 1004.003 of the Transportation Code without requesting a ruling from this office. Open Records Decision No. 673 (2001). We decline to issue such a previous determination at this time. Accordingly, this letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us. Therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
