Dear Ms. Henry:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 928777 (ORR#) P018442.

The Plano Police Department (the "department") received a request for incident number 21-187036. The department claims some of the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under sections 552.101 and 552.1175 of the Government Code. We have considered the exceptions the department claims and reviewed the submitted representative sample of information.¹

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. Section 552.101 encompasses the doctrine of common-law privacy. *Indus. Found. v. Tex. Indus. Accident Bd.*, 540 S.W.2d 668, 685 (Tex. 1976). Under the common-law right of privacy, an individual has a right to be free from the publicizing of private affairs in which the public has no legitimate concern. *Id.* at 682. The Third Court of Appeals has concluded public citizens' dates of birth are protected by common-law privacy pursuant to section 552.101. *See Paxton v. City of Dallas*, No. 03-13-00546-CV, 2015 WL 3394061, at *3 (Tex. App.—Austin May 22, 2015, pet. denied) (mem. op.). Thus,

the department must withhold all public citizens' dates of birth under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with common-law privacy.

Section 552.1175 of the Government Code provides in part:

(a) This section applies only to:

(1) current or honorably retired peace officers as defined by Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure[.]

(b) Information that relates to the home address, home telephone number, emergency contact information, date of birth, or social security number of an individual to whom this section applies, or that reveals whether the individual has family members is confidential and may not be disclosed to the public under this chapter if the individual to whom the information relates:

(1) chooses to restrict public access to the information; and

(2) notifies the governmental body of the individual's choice on a form provided by the governmental body, accompanied by evidence of the individual's status.

Gov't Code § 552.1175(a)(1), (b). The department informs us some of the remaining information relates to an individual who was licensed as a peace officer of another law enforcement agency at the time the information was created. Based on this representation, we find if the information at issue relates to an individual who is a current or honorably retired peace officer and who elects to restrict access to the information in accordance with section 552.1175(b), then the department must withhold the information we marked under section 552.1175 of the Government Code. *Cf.* Act of June 7, 2021, 87th Leg., R.S., S.B. 1134, § 9 (to be codified at Gov't Code § 552.117(c)) (providing "family member" has meaning assigned by Fin. Code § 31.006(d)). Conversely, if the individual whose information is at issue is not a current or honorably retired peace officer or does not elect to restrict access to the information in accordance with section 552.1175(b), the information we marked may not be withheld under section 552.1175. In either case, we find the department has not demonstrated the applicability of section 552.1175 to any portion of the remaining information, and the department may not withhold any of the remaining information on that basis.

We note some of the remaining information is subject to section 552.130 of the Government Code.² Section 552.130 provides information relating to a motor vehicle operator's license, driver's license, motor vehicle title or registration, or personal identification document issued by an agency of this state or another state or country is excepted from public release.

See Gov't Code § 552.130. Accordingly, the department must withhold the motor vehicle record information we marked under section 552.130 of the Government Code.

In summary, the department must withhold all public citizens' dates of birth under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with common-law privacy. If the information at issue relates to an individual who is a current or honorably retired peace officer and who elects to restrict access to the information in accordance with section 552.1175(b), then the department must withhold the information we marked under section 552.1175 of the Government Code. The department must withhold the motor vehicle record information we marked under section 552.130 of the Government Code. The department must release the remaining information.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
