Dear Mr. Overton:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 929058 (OGC# MW0155).

The Texas Department of Criminal Justice (the "department") received a request for information pertaining to a named individual. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under sections 552.101 and 552.134 of the Government Code. Additionally, we note the department provides documentation showing it notified the Monroe County Sheriff's Office and the Weatherford Police Department of the request and their rights to submit arguments to this office.¹ *See* Gov't Code § 552.304 (interested party may submit comments stating why information should or should not be released). We have considered the exceptions you claim and reviewed the submitted representative sample of information.²

Section 552.134 of the Government Code provides, in relevant part:

² We assume the "representative sample" of records submitted to this office is truly representative of the requested records as a whole. *See* Open Records Decision Nos. 499 (1988), 497 (1988). This open records letter does not reach, and therefore does not authorize the withholding of, any other requested records to the extent those records contain substantially different types of information than that submitted to this office.

(a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) or by Section 552.029, information obtained or maintained by the [department] is excepted from the requirements of Section 552.021 if it is information about an inmate who is confined in a facility operated by or under a contract with the department.

Gov't Code § 552.134(a). You state the submitted information concerns an inmate who was confined in a facility operated by the department. You state section 552.029 of the Government Code does not apply to the information at issue. Thus, we agree the information at issue is subject to section 552.134 of the Government Code. Therefore, the department must withhold the submitted information under section 552.134 of the Government Code.³

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
