Dear Ms. Treviño:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 935456 (PIR 22-0103-06).

The City of South Padre Island (the "city") received a request for a specified body worn camera recording. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under sections 552.101 and 552.130 of the Government Code. We have considered the exceptions you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.130 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure information relating to a motor vehicle operator's license, driver's license, motor vehicle title or registration, or personal identification document issued by an agency of this state or another state or country is excepted from public release. *See* Gov't Code § 552.130. The city asserts, and we agree, the submitted body worn camera recording contains confidential motor vehicle record information that is excepted from disclosure under section 552.130. In this instance, the city states it does not possess the technological capability to redact information from video files. Thus, we agree the city must withhold the submitted body worn camera recording under section 552.130 of the Government Code.<sup>1</sup> *See* Open Records Decision No. 364 (1983).

<sup>1</sup> As our ruling is dispositive, we need not address the remaining argument against disclosure of this information.
