Dear Ms. Tennyson:

This office issued Open Records Letter No. 2022-11065 (2022) on April 14, 2022. We have determined the prior ruling should be corrected.<sup>1</sup> *See* Gov't Code §§ 552.306, .352. Accordingly, we hereby withdraw the prior ruling. Consequently, this decision serves as the corrected ruling and is a substitute for Open Records Letter No. 2022-11065. *See generally* Gov't Code § 552.011 (providing that Office of Attorney General may issue decision to maintain uniformity in application, operation, and interpretation of Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code). Your request was assigned your request ID# 941874.

After reviewing your arguments and the submitted information, we have determined your request does not present a novel or complex issue. Thus, we are addressing your claims in a memorandum opinion. You claim the submitted information must be withheld from the requestor. Upon review of your arguments and the submitted information, we conclude you must withhold the submitted information pursuant to section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 261.201 of the Family Code.
