The Office of the Attorney General has received your request for a ruling and assigned your request ID# 942248.

After reviewing your arguments and the submitted representative sample of information, we have determined your request does not present a novel or complex issue.¹ Thus, we are addressing your claims in a memorandum opinion.² You claim the submitted information must be withheld from the requestor. Upon review of your arguments and the submitted information, we conclude you must withhold the submitted information pursuant to section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 261.201 of the Family Code.³

¹ We note you sought and received clarification of the information requested. *See* Gov't Code § 552.222(b) (governmental body may communicate with requestor for purposes of clarifying or narrowing request); *see also City of Dallas v. Abbott*, 304 S.W.3d 380, 387 (Tex. 2010) (holding that when governmental entity, acting in good faith, requests clarification or narrowing of unclear or overbroad request for public information, ten-day period to request attorney general ruling is measured from date request is clarified or narrowed). Additionally, we have received and considered comments from an interested third party. *See* Gov't Code § 552.305 (permitting interested third party to submit to attorney general reasons why requested information should not be released).

² We assume the "representative sample" of records submitted to this office is truly representative of the requested records as a whole. *See* Open Records Decision Nos. 499 (1988), 497 (1988). This open records letter does not reach, and therefore does not authorize the withholding of, any other requested records to the extent that those records contain substantially different types of information than that submitted to this office.

³ As our ruling is dispositive, we need not address the applicability of section 1701.661(a) of the Occupations Code to the submitted video recordings. *See generally* Occ. Code § 1701.661(a), (e).
