The Office of the Attorney General has received your request for a ruling and assigned your request ID# 946779 (ORR# P000379 and P000583).

After reviewing your arguments and the submitted information, we have determined your request does not present a novel or complex issue. Thus, we are addressing your claims in a memorandum opinion. You claim the submitted information must be withheld from the requestor pursuant to section 552.101 of the Government Code.¹ The requestors in this case know the identity of the victim in the report at issue. To protect the privacy of the individual to whom the information at issue relates, you must withhold the submitted information in its entirety under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with common-law privacy.
