Dear Mr. Love:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 975060.

The Office of the Inspector General of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice (the "department") received two requests from the same requestor for information pertaining to a specified incident involving a named inmate. You state you have released some information to the requestor. You also state the department will redact certain information under sections 552.117 and 552.1175 of the Government Code and social security numbers pursuant to section 552.147(b) of the Government Code.<sup>1</sup> You state the department does

<sup>1</sup> Open Records Letter No. 2005-01067 serves as a previous determination permitting the department to withhold the present and former home addresses and telephone numbers, social security numbers, and family member information of current or former employees of the department, regardless of whether they comply with section 552.1175 of the Government Code, under section 552.117(a)(3) of the Government Code without requesting a decision from this office. Additionally, we note section 552.117 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure the home addresses and telephone numbers, emergency contact information, social security numbers, and family member information of current or former officials or employees of a governmental body. *See* Gov't Code § 552.117(a)(1). Section 552.024 of the Government Code authorizes a governmental body to withhold information subject to section 552.117 without requesting a decision from this office if the current or former employee or official chooses not to allow public access to the information. *See id.* § 552.024(c). Section 552.1175(f) of the Government Code authorizes a governmental body to redact under section 552.1175(b), without the necessity of requesting a decision from this office, the home addresses and telephone numbers, emergency contact information, social security number, date of birth, and family member information of a peace officer as defined by article 2.12 of the Code of Criminal Procedure who properly elects to keep this information confidential. *See id.* § 552.1175(b), (f). Section 552.147(b) of the Government

not have information pertaining to portions of the request.<sup>2</sup> You claim the submitted information is exempted from disclosure under sections 552.101, 552.102, 552.117, 552.1175, 552.130, and 552.134 of the Government Code. We have considered the exceptions you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.134(a) of the Government Code relates to inmates of the department and provides the following:

Except as provided by Subsection (b) or by Section 552.029 [of the Government Code], information obtained or maintained by the [department] is exempted from [required public disclosure] if it is information about an inmate who is confined in a facility operated by or under a contract with the department.

Gov't Code § 552.134(a). Section 552.134 is explicitly made subject to section 552.029, which provides, in relevant part, the following:

Notwithstanding Section . . . 552.134, the following information about an inmate who is confined in a facility operated by or under a contract with the [department] is subject to required disclosure under Section 552.021:

. . .

(8) basic information regarding the death of an inmate in custody, an incident involving the use of force, or an alleged crime involving the inmate.

*Id.* § 552.029(8). Upon review, we agree the submitted information constitutes information about an inmate for purposes of section 552.134. However, the submitted information pertains to an alleged crime involving the inmate. Thus, pursuant to section 552.029, the department must release basic information from the submitted information. Basic information includes the time and place of the incident, names of inmates and department officials directly involved, a brief narrative of the incident, a brief description of any injuries sustained, and information regarding criminal charges or disciplinary actions filed as a result of the incident. Accordingly, with the exception of basic information, which must be released, the department must withhold the submitted information under section 552.134 of the Government Code.<sup>3</sup>

Code authorizes a governmental body to redact a living person's social security number from public release without the necessity of requesting a decision from this office. *See id.* § 552.147(b).

<sup>2</sup> We note the Act does not require a governmental body to disclose information that did not exist at the time the governmental body received the request for information. *Econ. Opportunities Dev. Corp. v. Bustamante*, 562 S.W.2d 266 267-68 (Tex. Civ. App.—San Antonio 1978, writ dismissed); Open Records Decision Nos. 605 at 2 (1992), 452 at 3 (1986), 362 at 2 (1983).

<sup>3</sup> As our ruling is dispositive, we need not address your remaining arguments against disclosure of this information.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.
